- The compositions all feature the artist's signature vibrant colour palette


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Artist David Hockney has unveiled his new high-tech art created on his phone and tablet after swapping his paintbrush for his **iPad**.

David Hockney was born in Bradford and has since gone on to become a draughtsman, painter, printmaker, stage designer and photographer.

He was a key influence in the 1960's pop art movement and is now considered to be one of the most influential British artists of the 20th century.



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Forty-four of the images were created on Hockney's iPhone and the rest on his iPad. The compositions all feature the artist's signature vibrant colour palette.
